## **KU42 OVERLAY AND CONSTRUCTION PROJECT**

SLCDA will mill and overlay runway 16/34 and a portion of the taxiway A at South Valley Regional Airport (KU42) late summer through early fall.

Phase I begins August 1 and runs through September 30 (60 days) and includes: realigning taxiway B at the south end, removing taxiways A1 and A2, and constructing a new aircraft run up area, which will be located to the north of its present location. The runway with a temporary displaced threshold will be continuously available until October 1 with a temporary runway length of 5,300 feet.

Phase II (milling and resurfacing taxiway A from A5 to A4 near the corporate hangars) will be done concurrently with phase I approximately September 16 – 30.

During construction phases I and II fixed wing back taxiing on the runway may be required for takeoff.

Phase III (runway milling and resurfacing) begins October 1 and ends October 10. The airport will be closed to all fixed wing operations during that time.

Tie downs will be made available at Salt Lake City International Airport (KSLC) for tenants who desire access to their aircraft during Phase III.

More information will follow as the project nears.

## **U42 PLANE WASH**

The plane wash at South Valley Regional Airport (U42) is open and fully operable.

The plane wash is coin operated so be sure to bring a pocketful of quarters to activate it.

## **SOUTH VALLEY FBO STATUS PUBLIC MEETING**

The Salt Lake City Department of Airports (SLCDA) will hold a community briefing on the status of the South Valley Regional Airport fixed base operator (FBO) request for proposal.

The meeting is scheduled for Tuesday May 3 at 4:00 pm at the SLCDA Training and Activities Center located at 1911 North 2200 West. Contact Dave Teggins at 801-561-7531 with questions.

## **KSLC RWY 17/35 ASPHALT OVERLAY PROJECT**

SLCDA will mill and overlay runway 17/35, taxiways P and R, and remove connecting taxiway K2 at Salt Lake City International Airport (KSLC). This will be done in four phases.

Phase I – taxiways R and K9 closed for 20 calendar days (24 hrs/day), July 5 – 25.

Phase II – taxiway K1 and runway 14/32 closed for 10 calendar days (24 hrs/day), July 26 – August 4. Runway 14/32 will be available during the project except for this time.

Phase III – runway 17/35 and taxiway P will be closed for 40 calendar days (24 hrs/day), August 5 – September 13.

Phase IV – runway 17/35 and associated taxiways will be available for daylight operations September 14 - October 13. At night crews will be upgrading lighting, surface painting, and grooving the runway.

Notice to proceed will be issued July 5, 2016. Runway 17/35 will be closed for 70 calendar days.

The entire project should be completed by mid-October.

More information will follow as the project nears.

General aviation hangar inspections are in progress. Many of the inspected hangars have expired fire extinguishers.

Tenants must provide and maintain appropriate fire extinguishers, which must be inspected and certified annually by a competent certification authority. Newly purchased fire extinguishers have not been inspected and therefore do not meet the inspection requirements.
